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MINUTES OF ST FRANCIS PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION COMMITTEE MEETING

Friday 5th June 2026 at 11h00 – SFPO Office 9 Philippa Place / Zoom

1. **Welcome**

3. **Confirmation of the Previous Minutes**

4. **Matters arising from the Previous Minutes of Meeting**

None

5. **Finance**

- The financial statements for May were circulated by PLP and approved.
- Membership for the 2025/6 year stands at 529 subscriptions.
- 565 subscriptions were recorded for the previous year (ie 2024/5).
- R25 000 donation is to be made to the R330 pothole repair project
- R50 000 donation has been made to the Thyspunt Alliance

6. **Association Projects**

• **Street Signs**

The project is now complete with a few spare kerbstones in store. Ongoing maintenance will be needed occasionally when kerbs are knocked over or grass needs to be cut back. A few more kerbs will be placed where residents have requested additional and some older kerbs in Santareme still need to be re-faced.

• **Pedestrian Walkway Nevil Rd to Port.**

This is a KBF St Francis led project.

Construction Phases:

O Phase 1 : Liege Road to Lyme Road North. Completed

O Phase 2 : Lyme Road North to Sunset/Sea Glades junction. Completed

O Phase 3 : Liege Road to Nevil Road. Funds available

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- O Phase 4 : Nevil Road, from St Francis Drive to Main Beach Car Park. Funds available
- O Phase 5 : Nevil Road to Tarragona to R330. Requires funding
- O Phase 6 : Tarragona to the Port/Otters Landing. Requires funding
- The Association has set aside R100 000 for pathway continuation.
- **Pedestrian Walkway Lighting**
A resident approached the Association to support a crowd funding initiative to install street lighting along the footpath. PM has liaised with the developer of Grand Comoros regarding the cost of installation of the solar lighting he has already done for the section of the pedestrian walkway he had constructed alongside his development. This was raised at a meeting with the KLM regarding approval process. No further discussion. PM
- **Sea Vista Pathway Story Board:**
LA contacted the contractor for a time line to progress with construction, and we will need to wait until the contractor gets back from an overseas contract commitment in mid June. LA/CG
- **Sea Vista Pathway Maintenance** : KLM are responsible for the maintenance of the pathway. It has been added to the Ward Action List and continues to be raised at the Ward Committee meetings. LA
- **Main Beach Pavilion**
WF has engaged with the KLM about replacing the Ablution block on Main Beach with a Beach Pavilion which could include an office for the SFPO. An EIA will be required. WF has also engaged with two sets of developers to create interest in this development. WF will pursue with both KLM and the developers. WF
- **Granny's Pool Amenities and Two Harbour Walkway** : DH is in discussions with the Kromme Enviro Trust around planting certain vegetation to attempt to stabilize the dune slippage problems along the walkway. A consultant is working with Council and KET to find a way to get the necessary approvals for the Granny's Pool and walkway concept. The Coastal Management Plan is being developed and this would remove the requirement for a 100m high water set back line. DH and CC will establish when this is likely to be completed and arrange a meeting with KLM ECO Nomvelo Siwela and EMC ECO Dylan Anderson. The Ward Councilor is trying to assist with emergency funding and permission to conduct much needed repair works at Granny's tidal pool and car park in the meantime. DH
- **Erf 53**
WF provided a copy of our written Spatial Development Framework submission, which includes Erf 53 (public open space), to Councillor Ruth. DH is to ensure that this is included in planning for the future, possibly as primary access to Main beach. Erf 53 should be included in an overall EIA for the beach front. St Francis Court HOA are prepared to assist with this project. WF/DH
- **Erf 400 and Erf 554 Village Common**
We continue to await DPW decision on transfer of Erf 400 to KLM. A community park has been suggested for Erf 554 to include Erf 400 once the transfer from DPW has taken place.
- **George Rd Car Park Repair** : KLM has been granted disaster funding for this repair. Work is underway.



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- **Tree Planting Project**

Coral trees were chosen for planting along St Francis Drive from Harbour Road to the Port. The proposed next phase for the project will be St Francis Drive from the Village to the Sunset Drive intersection. A donation of 20 large stumps has been received and planting will commence next week giving another 200 meters of tree line. At present no budget is required.

- **Traffic Circles** : The Association will look at funding four traffic circles to replace stop streets on St Francis Drive at the intersections of Lyme Rd North, Lyme Road South, Assissi Drive and Taragona Rd. Costs and designs were investigated by C Northwood. A KLM official said that we would need to complete a formal traffic survey to justify these traffic circles. This project has been shelved for the time being.

- **Thyspunt Alliance**: The Association is in support of the Alliance who will be monitoring the renewed proposal for a nuclear site at Thyspunt. CC represents the Association and the Association will participate in any way it can to hold ESKOM accountable and assist with getting the best possible outcome for our community and economy. CC prepared and submitted three objecting submissions, from the SFPO Association, the SFPO NPC and the CPF. MT confirmed the SFBROA have submitted their objection. The KJRC have joined the Thyspunt Alliance and made a donation. They have urged all members estates to consider joining.

We have met with the Mayor and officially requested that the power station is removed from the draft Spatial Development Framework.

WSP, the Environmental Practitioner invited the SFPO and other community representatives to a meeting with ESKOM which gave us an opportunity to clearly voice our concerns and objections.

The Association has donated R50 000 to the Thyspunt Alliance towards the legal costs that will be involved and CC has received a call to thank the Association for their support.

7. NPC Projects

- **Long Term Coastal Protection Solution (LTCPS)**

This project is progressing on schedule. The first and second groynes are complete. The damage resulting from the recent storms and flood events on NG 5 and NG 6 is being addressed. Overall the groynes stood up very well against these testing conditions and protected the spit from breaching. Work on NG 1 and NG 3 has been delayed as the rock required was not available. Heavier rock is needed and discussions are in progress with the contractor to address this. Nuplant has been appointed to lay the heavier armouring rock going forward. The dredger was moved into the canals to avoid any flooding resulting from the most recent storm. Construction of the access to the 4th groyne is complete. Dredging of sand onto the spit beach will continue however a lot of sand is being brought back on to the beaches by natural accretion.

- **Roads** – As part of KLM's resealing of roads project across Kouga, work will start in St Francis Bay in July.

- **CCTV Security Cameras**

All are functioning well. The 7 year contract expires in September and a new contract is being negotiated with new and additional cameras. Intersec will provide cameras and

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maintenance and Calibre Security will be responsible for the monitoring. We have asked for a plan and costing for cameras for the whole of St Francis Bay to consider.

8. Marketing and Communication

8.1 Database

- Databases for the SRA Demarcated area are supplied by KLM quarterly. The number of rateable properties in this area has increased because of the new developments. These databases do not include Santareme and other St Francis Bay areas. JV will promote membership on his Future of Santareme WhatsApp group. LA

8.2 Website, Social Media and Newsletter

- The newsletters have been focussing on LTCPS news. CJ published a newsletter this week as well as a newsflash on the repairs required on the groynes which attracted a lot of interest. He is also assisting Thyspunt Alliance with communication. He continues using his revised media campaign to promote Association membership in St Francis Today and in the last newsletter, targeting new residents and those not being reached through our database. LA/CJ
- The Info Ads page was redesigned to feature Association projects to boost interest in membership.

8.3 Membership

- The membership renewal invoice run went out in early October, with a second run in the last week of November, and a final run was sent in February. There will be a pre-launch awareness campaign in September/October this year. LA/CJ
- A less administrative system with more flexibility for recording and invoicing membership needs to be investigated.
- CC will represent the SFPO at the Kromme Enviro Trust table at the monthly market to promote membership. CC
- The revenue allows us to invest in larger and more meaningful community projects and services. It also lends representational weight for our Association in our dealings with the Municipality.
- It is thought that the slight drop in membership is due to the large number of properties that have changed hands in recent times ie running at about 14% of properties per year.
- We are speaking to the estate agents and encouraging them to be proactive in promoting the Association. An example of how they could do this would be to purchase their client's first subscription on their behalf. LA/WF
- Membership can also be promoted for Links residents. DH and WF have spoken to the new Board on how best to go about this and DH will follow up. DH/WF
- Calibre included a short reminder/promotion for membership on their regular invoice runs. PM



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9. Community Issues

- **KLM Focus:** KLM have listed roads, waste water treatment and solar energy as their focus over the current two year cycle ie 2024-2026.
- **Spatial Development Framework & Precinct Plan:** A new SDF is being developed. We must then assume that once it is signed off by KLM Council then a new Precinct Plan will follow. WF to verify with KLM.
- **Sewerage:** There has been better management of sewerage collection. However the Association continues to call for an audit of the sewerage system through the Ward Committee. The public are encouraged to order sewerage uplifts using the Municipality WhatsApp number. The public need to be aware that they will be charged additionally if more than one upift per month is ordered. Sewerage spills into the canals continue around the Mayotte Circle / small boat harbour area. A water borne sewerage system connecting this area to the main line was designed and needs to be reinvestigated. WF/MT
- **Water infrastructure:** The SFPO Association continues to put pressure on KLM to replace failing water infrastructure with emphasis on Canal and Shore Roads. A letter was handed to the Municipal Manager last year demanding urgent resolution. This was prioritised and new pressure reduction valves have been installed.
- **Roads:** We were told that the tender process for the resurfacing of the R330 from Humansdorp to Cape St Francis is on the Provincial Roads list for 2026/27. The private individuals who have undertaken repair of potholes on the R330 in the interim were acknowledged and thanked. The Association have pledged R25 000 for this project. WF
- **Storm Water drains:** JV has requested that this is on the agenda for meetings with KLM MM. A storm water master plan is needed for the area from Santareme to the Port. JV



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10. Other Committees

- **SFBRHOA:** MT confirmed SFBRHOA will contribute R100 000 for the Thyspunt Alliance. There is confusion with the building lines being passed in the canal area which is being addressed with the Planning Department. Provision for more boat parking is being discussed in Ski Canal to provide access to the beaches. A meeting was held with the commercial boat owners and the municipality regarding proposed increases in their fee structure and conditions of their operation on the canal waterways. The MOA is being updated and rewritten and by-laws updated. After the recent flooding events, the water in the canals is extremely low at low tide and this is being monitored carefully as dredging can only commence once the sediment in the water has settled and visibility improves. MT
- **KJRC:** The chairman of the KJRC has been kept abreast of progress with the LTCPS project plan. The KJRC would like to participate in the process with the SFBRHOA by-law updates. Boating continues to be discouraged in the river until such time as the muddy waters clear sufficiently to allow safe navigation. ND
- **Santareme:** DH reported that the dune lake behind Santareme is brim full and being carefully monitored. He has requested photograph of both this and the Sand River dune dams. JV/DH

JV and DH represent the interests of Santareme (term we use for Santareme, St Francis-on-Sea, Port and Otters Landing) property owners on the SFPO Association. Their main focus is centred around:

 - the problem of dune erosion
 - CCTV Camera Phase 1 contract expired at the end of November 2025 and DH and his team have renegotiated costs and replacement of cameras with Calibre for the next three years. They are trying to attract more Santareme residents to commit to paying for the cameras
 - good progress has been made on the roads and storm water drainage planning. Allocation has been decided now that EAS have completed the assessment of all the roads and has been released.
- **Community Policing Forum:** An AGM of the CPF took place on 30th April which all local community organisations (registered with the KLM) invited to attend and vote. David Truter has stood down and Clint Carstens was voted in as chairman. CC held his first Exco meeting on 27th May and a full CPF meeting will be planned toward the end of this month. It has been agreed that funding from the Association will be allocated for Boots on the Ground to patrol Main Beach in December this year. Billy's Beach have pledged some funds towards this protection. CC/PM

The protest action against undocumented foreigners is being closely monitored by SAPS and other agencies.
- **DVG:** No discussion.
- **Ward Committee:** LA attend these meetings. The next meeting will take place on place on 11th June. LA
- **Environmental Monitoring Committee :** This Committee is set to meet again on 22nd May 2026. This was prescribed by DEDEAT for environmental compliance of the Long Term Coastal Protection Scheme (LTCPS) by the appointed ECO, Dylan Anderson, with oversight from the EO which is Ted Avis of CES. Serving on this are representatives from The Municipality, DEDEAT, Kromme Enviro Trust, SFPO, Riparians HOA, Kromme Joint LA/CC/DH



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River Committee, and Kouga Business Forum. Clint Carstens represents the SFPO on this committee along with David Harpur. Minutes of these meetings are on the SFPO website.

- **Sea Vista:** No discussion
